Introduction

In addition to its <u>open-call listings</u>, On the Move regularly creates, updates, and publishes <u>Cultural Mobility Funding Guides</u> in partnership with, and with the support of, other organisations. These guides are meant to be a resource for artists and arts workers looking to finance their cross-border travel to and/or from a specific country, world-region, or continent. They also serve as mappings of existing opportunities that can be a useful reference document for policy makers and funders at the local, national, European and international levels.

This guide, updated by the Arts and Theatre Institute thanks to the support of the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic, is dedicated to the funding opportunities for international cultural exchange between the Czech Republic and the world and it is based on the two respective editions from 2011 and 2018.

How to navigate this guide?

This guide lists local, national and international resources, both public and private. Only regular opportunities accessible online are listed. Funds which only provide information offline, which do not invite applications through open calls, or which are ad hoc or temporary are not included.

Reading suggestion:

We recommend that you download the guide and open it using Acrobat Reader. You can then click on the web links and consult the funding schemes and resources. Alternatively, you can also copy and paste the web links of the schemes/resources that interest you in your browser's URL field. As this guide is long, we advise you not to print it, especially since all resources are web-based.

The programs are listed and numbered in an identical manner as in the Czech language version.

There are various reasons a user of this guide might seek mobility funding, including:

- They have been selected for a project in a foreign country (collaboration project, artistic residency, participation in a festival, etc.) but have not been provided with funding for their mobility costs.
- They have developed a project with an international component and wish to invite foreign artists and cultural professionals to one or more places/countries for co-production, touring, market development, etc.
- They are interested in working experiences (including training) in a foreign country and are seeking a way to cover their travel costs.

In light of these different aims, the entries in this guide present the costs that are covered by each scheme, including cross-border travel, visas, per diems, remuneration of collaborators, accommodation, production costs, and other types of support (e.g. translation).

Like On the Move's other Cultural Mobility Funding Guides, this publication includes:

- Opportunities provided by a diverse range of funders: international organisations, regional bodies, national institutions, local authorities, private foundations, etc.
- Schemes supporting a variety of mobility formats, including peer meetings, workshops, residencies, travel grants, training programs, and networking opportunities, with the aim of supporting everything from collaboration to cultural production, professional development, and the evolution of sector-wide practices.
- Only opportunities for which cross-border travel costs are at least partially funded. We also list local, regional and international programs that include transnational mobility as a component of their support to artists and cultural organisations in the region.
- Opportunities from all arts disciplines: performing arts (theatre, dance, opera, circus, street arts); visual arts (painting, sculpture, photography, installation, applied arts); new media arts and web-based arts; music; literature (writing, translation); heritage (tangible heritage, movable heritage, intangible heritage, archives); interdisciplinary arts; research; cultural management.

This program promotes cooperation and mobility in all spheres of education and training, and in relation to sport and young people. It is open to individuals (e.g. students, teachers, and volunteers) and organisations (e.g. schools, youth organisations, and NGOs). The Program includes two Key Actions (KA): Mobility of Individuals (KA1), and Cooperation Among Organisations and Institutions (KA2).

5. Goethe-Institut: Translation Funding Program

Support for international professional publishers who wish to translate German-language books.

Grant funding for translations of works written in the German language and published in printed form by a publisher in a German-speaking country. The translation must be of an original German text.

The nationality of the author is irrelevant to the application, with the restriction that applications for works of fiction by contemporary Austrian authors must be submitted to the Austrian Federal Ministry of Arts, Culture, Public Service and Sport (BMKÖS) and to Pro Helvetia for contemporary Swiss authors.

9. Culture Moves Europe: Residency Action

Calls for residency hosts provide financial support to organisations

The Residency Action of Culture Moves Europe supports organisations and artists (registered as legal entities) who wish to welcome between 1 and 5 international artists and/or cultural professionals for a residency project. It encourages collaboration between hosts, artists and cultural professionals from different disciplines and backgrounds. Through this action, Culture Moves Europe aims to further develop a close-knit artistic and cultural ecosystem across the European Union and beyond. Funded by the European Union, Culture Moves Europe is implemented by the Goethe Institut.

10. International Visegrad Fund: V4 Gen Mini-Grants

Short term mobility grants for young people aged 12-30 from the V4 countries

The V4 Gen Mini-Grant supports the short-term mobility of youth in the 12–30 age group. Projects promote democratic values, civic participation and cross-border dialog among young people. Applicants share ideas, meet neighbours, make new friends and gain new skills and experience. Each project must involve the mobility of young people (12–30 years old) from at least two V4 countries, i.e., cross-border visits. Every project must have at least one joint physical presentation for the public or local community, combined with creative forms of mediated outreach.

As a new V4 Gen Mini-Grant pilot, the program also supports short-term mobility for applicants based in Ukraine.

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14. International Visegrad Fund: Visegrad Fellowship Program

Short-term mobility for researchers from the V4 countries

The Visegrad Fellowship Program offers funding for individual short-term stays for V4 scholars, lecturers and researchers (citizens of Czechia, Hungary, Poland, or Slovakia) in V4 countries others than their country of citizenship. As a pilot project, Ukrainian citizens are eligible to apply as well.

The fellowships are provided for a limited period ranging from 2 to 10 weeks during which the respective fellow is to conduct (or participate in) a concrete research project, hold lecture(s) or seminars at a higher-education level, or study or review specific sets of written or other materials available in a public archive or library.

15. International Visegrad Fund: Western Balkans-Visegrad Fellowships

Short term mobility grants for researchers from the V4 countries and the Western Balkans

The Western Balkans-Visegrad Fellowships (pilot program) offer funding for individual short-term stays for V4 and WB6 scholars, lecturers, academic staff, researchers and scientists in two main directions: citizens of V4 countries can apply to relevant host institutions in the Western Balkans (WB6), and citizens of the WB6 region can apply to relevant host institutions in V4 countries.

The fellowships are provided for a limited period ranging from 2 to 10 weeks during which the respective fellow is to conduct (or participate in) a concrete research project, hold lecture(s) or seminars at a higher-education level, or study or review specific sets of written or other materials available in a public archive or library.

The experience is based in Milan, the heart of the fashion industry, for two months, with the possibility of visits to Rome as well. Research and "live fashion" within the context of individual exploration is supported by lectures and experiences with Accademia Costume & Moda.

The goal is to embrace diversity in applications and reach out to artists, digital artists, designers and communicators interested in understanding the Italian fashion system and supply chain.

Literary residencies are intended to develop and promote V4 literature by providing support for the work and mobility of talented writers of fiction and non-fiction, poets, essayists and critics, as well as literary translators, publicists and journalists from V4 countries by creating a platform for literary exchanges.

The program is based on a partnership of 4 host institutions, one in each V4 country: the Arts and Theatre Institute in Prague, Petőfi Literary Museum in Budapest, the Villa Decius Association in Krakow and the Slovak Literary Centre in Bratislava.

ERSTE Foundation offers fourteen fellowships for young artists and emerging curators for intensive workshops of one to four weeks.

Well-known artists, curators and critics from all over the world offer courses focusing on topical questions of art production, as well as curatorial practice and writing about art.

Founded in 1953 by Oskar Kokoschka as the "School of Seeing" in Hohensalzburg Fortress, it is the oldest of its kind in Europe.

Every year, some 300 participants from more than 50 countries attend some 20 courses offered in two fixed locations: Hohensalzburg Fortress and the Untersberg quarry in Fürstenbrunn, as well as further temporary spaces in the town of Salzburg.

ON THE MOVE

On the Move is the international information network dedicated to artistic and cultural mobility, gathering 78 members from 29 countries. Since 2002, On the Move has been working to provide regular, up-to-date and free information on mobility opportunities, conditions and funding, and to advocate for the value of cross-border cultural mobility. Co-funded by the European Union and the French Ministry of Culture, On the Move is implementing an ambitious multiannual program to build the capacities of local, regional, national, European and international stakeholders for the sustainable development of our cultural ecosystems.

In addition to its open call listings, On the Move regularly creates, updates, and publishes Cultural Mobility Funding Guides. These guides are meant to be a resource for artists and other arts workers looking to finance their cross-border travel to and/or from a specific country, world region, or continent. They also serve as mappings of existing opportunities that can be a useful reference document for policymakers and funders at the local, national, European and international levels.



The Arts and Theatre Institute (ATI) is a state-funded organisation established by the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic. The mission of ATI is to provide the Czech and international public with a comprehensive range of services in the field of theatre and other arts (music, literature, dance and visual arts). The ATI collects and archives works and objects relating to the theatre and facilitates access to them. It pursues research, organises and participates in international projects across all disciplines of art, supports internationalisation of the Czech cultural scene and publishes scholarly work. The ATI is also where the Czech Creative Europe Desk – Culture is based.

The ATI newsletter <u>Culturenet</u> brings you the latest highlights, open calls, publications and events from the field of Czech culture.



<u>CzechMobility.Info</u> is one of the projects of the ATI. It is a Czech InfoPoint providing advice in the areas of international artistic cooperation and orientation in the Czech labor law environment. Its aim is to help professionals engaged in the cultural sector to deal with the practical issues such as contracts, taxes, visas or insurance. The core of the project lies in the online information portal, but the InfoPoint's activities also include consultations and workshops.
